Job Title: **Health House Staff**

Reports to: *Head Nurse*

Position Purpose:

To support and maintain the health of campers and staff.

Essential Job Functions:

- ◆ Dispense meds
- ◆ First aid for minor injuries
- ◆ Ensure health and safety of campers and staff
- ◆ Medical record keeping
- ◆ Liaising with Camp Medical Team, local doctors, hospitals, and pharmacies
- ◆ Communicate with relevant staff and volunteers regarding specific medical issues
- ◆ Communicate with parents
- ◆ Accompany sick/injured campers or staff to the hospital or to medical appointments
- ◆ Participate in camp activities and events

Qualifications:

- ◆ RN or LPN degree (nursing students may be considered to assist in Health House)
- ◆ Oregon state licensure
- ◆ ER and/or pediatric unit experience preferred, but not required
- ◆ New nursing graduates are welcome

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

- ◆ Experience with children
- ◆ Flexible-- able to adapt to different environments and schedules
- ◆ Confidence in nursing skills
- ◆ Responsible, hard-working
- ◆ Good bedside manner, friendly and personable
- ◆ Strong assessment abilities
- ◆ Enjoy an active lifestyle
- ◆ Team player

Physical Aspects of the Job:

- ◆ Ability to communicate and work with groups and interact as necessary with campers and staff.
- ◆ Ability to observe camper and staff behavior and provide both positive and constructive feedback as necessary

- ◆ Enforce appropriate safety regulations and emergency procedures.
- ◆ Physical ability to respond appropriately to situations requiring first aid.
- ◆ Must be able to assist campers and staff in an emergency (fire, evacuation, illness, or injury)
- ◆ Strength and endurance required to administer to the health needs of campers 24/7.

Salary Information

\$450 - \$650/week depending on position on experience.

Some physical requirements of the Health House staff could be endurance including prolonged standing, some bending, stooping, walking long distances, hiking, climbing, and stretching; willing to live in a camp setting and work irregular hours with limited or simple equipment and facilities; and with daily exposure to the sun, heat, and animals such as bugs, snakes, bats, etc.
